Supper @ **Second** is off to a tremendous start. We are serving roughly 125 people and are beginning to see more guests from the community. The purpose of this ministry is three-fold: 1) As an outreach to our community; 2) As a service to our members; 3) As an opportunity to strengthen relationships.

Supper @ **Second** provides us all an opportunity to invite our friends and neighbors to a non-threatening event where there are no strings attached beyond sitting and breaking bread together.

We are committed to offering this as a free meal. In order to do that there are several ways we can all help. On the white bulletin board there is a sign up sheet to donate items on that week's menu. The more items that are donated, the less needs to be purchased. Those donations need to be at church the Sunday before each Wednesday (With the exception of desserts – which may be brought in on the Wednesday morning). There is also a donation basket that will be kept in the kitchen for any members who would like to make a donation. This is meant to be kept out of sight so there is no pressure for anyone to donate.


College Care Packages: Packing Up Love

Observation...Interpretation...Application


Recently several members participated in a forum of churches desiring to learn about creating cultures of discipleship within the church. How can we create a culture that helps foster our continued growth as followers of Christ? One of the action steps that we would like to implement relates to our meetings. One of the things churches do a lot is meet. Because this is already a part of the rhythm of what we do, we'd like to add one practice to our meetings to enhance our discipleship culture. Many meetings begin with prayer. We'd like to add the practice of reading a brief scripture followed by a brief discussion: What does it say (observation)? What does it mean (interpretation)? What is the application? The value in this practice is that we will learn to engage God's word with one another and we will learn to hear his voice together. If you are chairing a meeting, in addition to prayer, we'd like to invite you to begin with a brief scripture with those three questions: What does it say? What does it mean? What is the application?

What's This I Hear About The Denomination?

As you may or may not know, The Reformed Church in America has been wrestling with issues related to homosexuality as have many other denominations. While the official position of the R.C.A. is that the practice of homosexuality is a sin, there are a number of churches within the denomination that think and act differently. At last year's General Synod (annual gathering) a team was tasked with the assignment of coming back to the General Synod in 2020 with one of the following three recommendations:

- I) staying together
- 2) radical reconstituting and reorganization
- 3) grace-filled separation.

What does this mean for Second? We will wait until June of 2020 when we learn what path the denomination is choosing to take to make any decisions regarding our continued membership in the denomination. Until then, we will continue to do ministry under the banner of Christ within the R.C.A. Please contact Pastor Scott if you have any questions.
